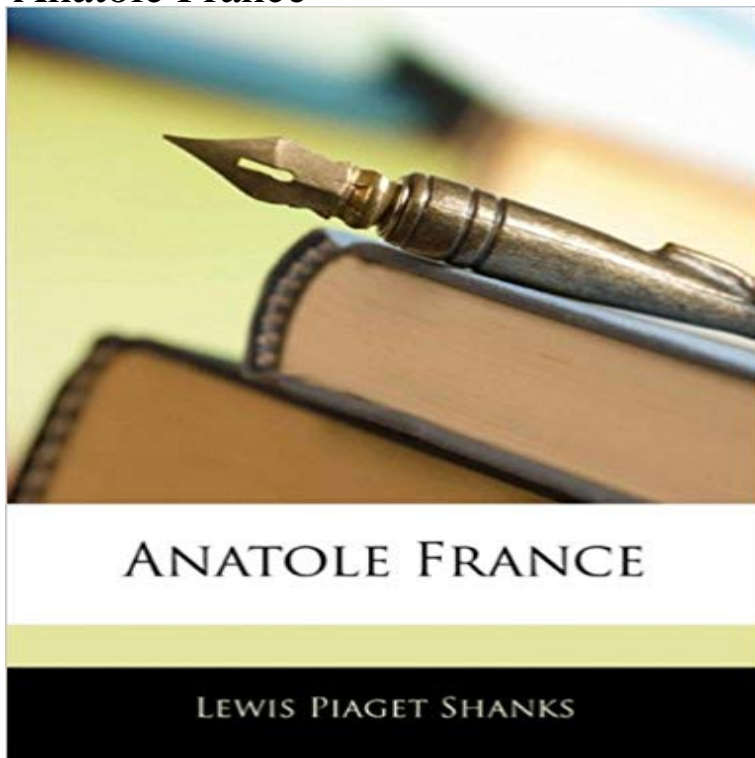


## Anatole France
