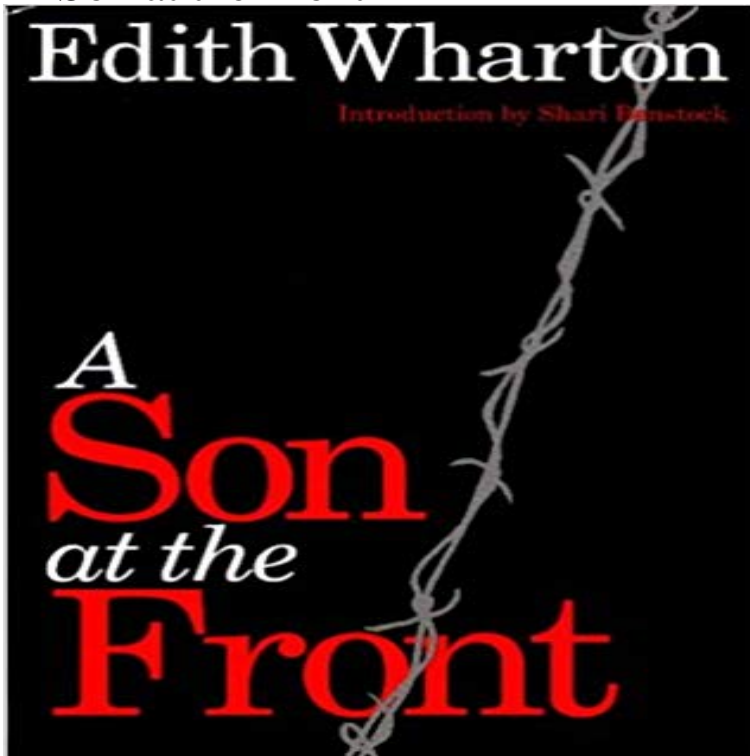


A Son at the Front
