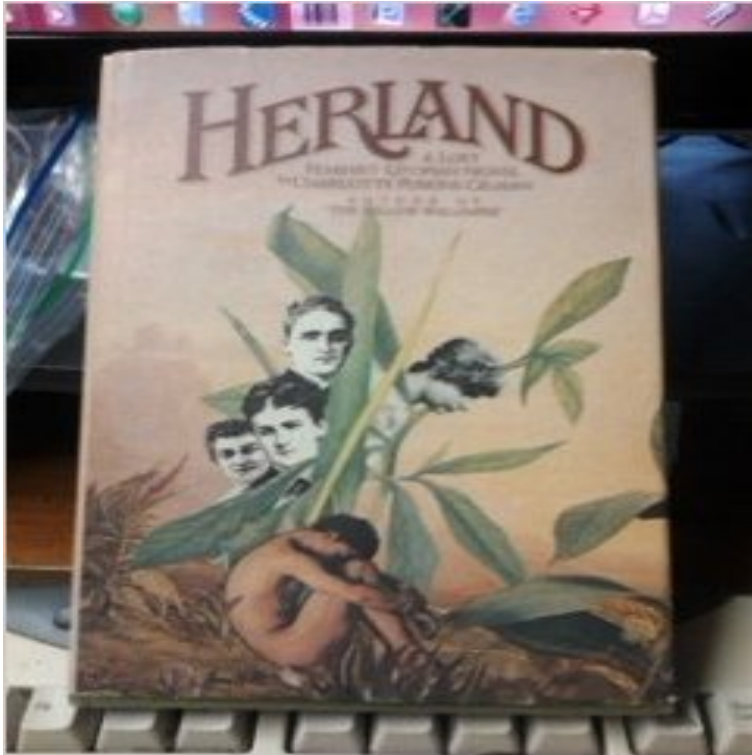


# Herland
