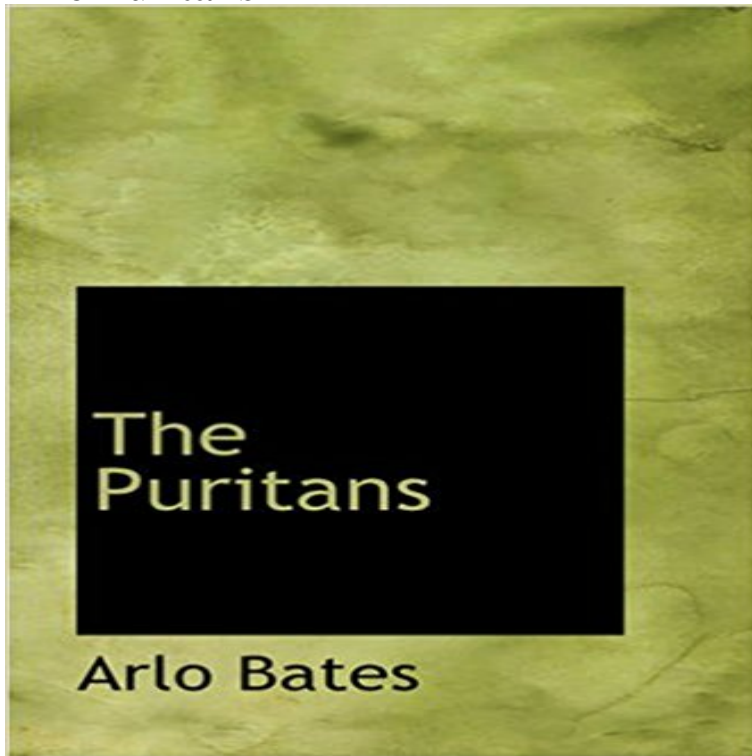


The Puritans
