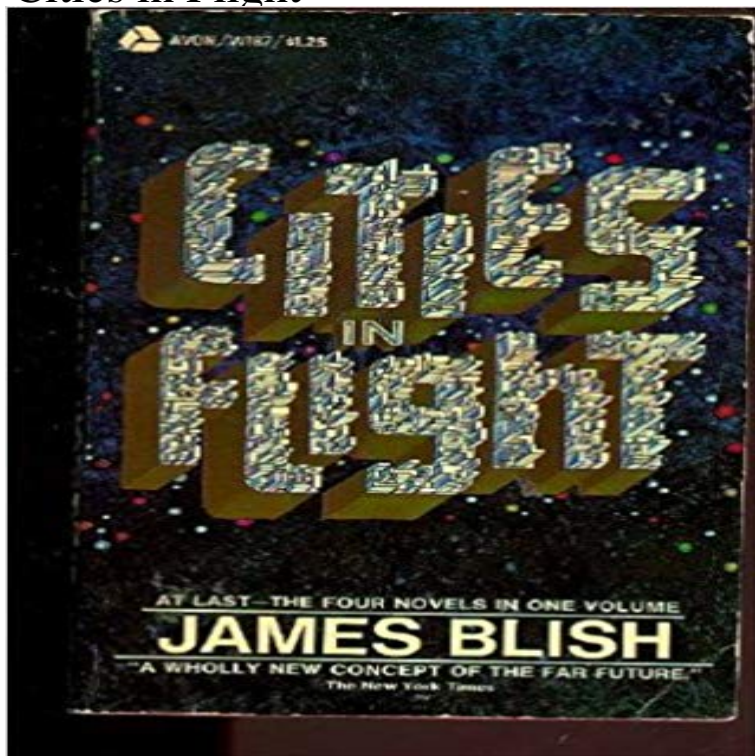


Cities in Flight
