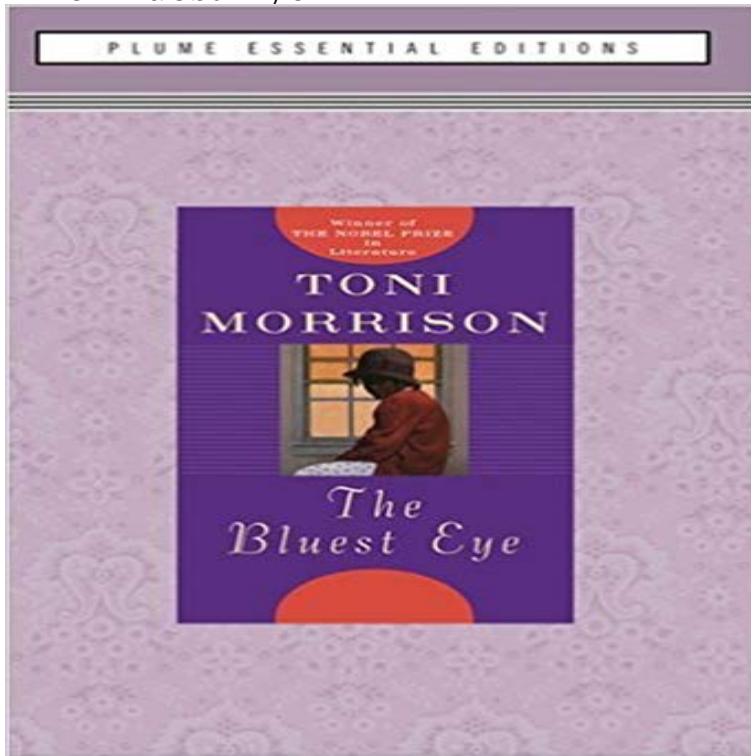


# The Bluest Eye
