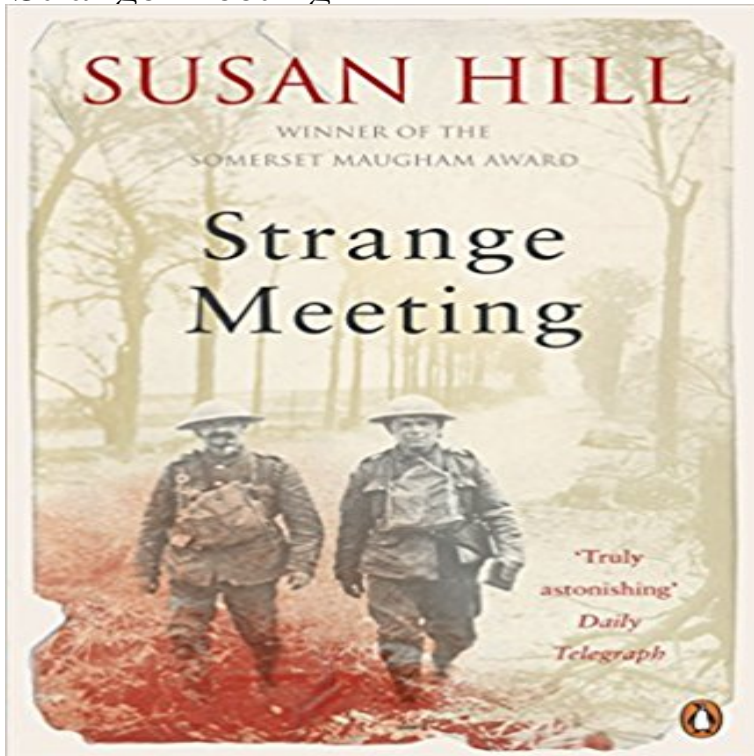


## Strange Meeting
