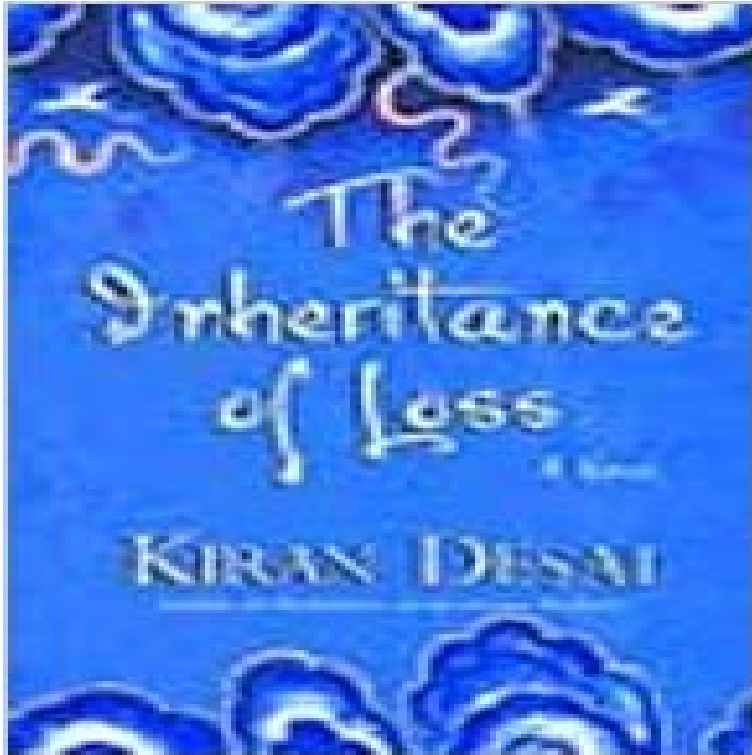


## The Inheritance of Loss: A Novel
